

Leslie Brothers is the **Director of the Ulrich Museum of Art** where she has launched a new vision for the institution "the future now at the Ulrich." Programing includes, a series of exhibitions entitled *Solving for X*, visualizations of campus research and "FUN" pecha kucha style presentations of scholarship across campus. Her focus is on connecting the Ulrich more directly to academic programs and research across campus in ways that invite and include community.

She was formerly the Director for 17 years of the McDonough Museum of Art, Youngstown State University's Center for Contemporary Art in Youngstown Ohio. Leslie also served as an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Art teaching courses in contemporary art, theory, and in the potential for artists to affect change in society. She received her master's degree in Art History and Contemporary Criticism from Virginia Commonwealth University graduating with honors. She has a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee where she majored in Art History and French. In addition, she received an honors degree in Women's Studies. Leslie is a museum professional who has worked in large municipal museums such as, the Brooklyn Museum, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts and the Milwaukee Art Museum, as well as University Museums and Galleries.

For Leslie collaboration is part of the creative process. Her area of expertise is Contemporary Art and Culture and her research is based in rethinking the University Art Museum as a research center for understanding consciousness and human experience through the arts. Over the past 30 years she has published exhibition catalogues, articles and reviews; she has organized over 60 exhibitions and created community-based programs that address the value of diversity, inclusion, equity and social justice, essential to maintaining relevance in the arts.

In 2014 she participated in TEDxYoungstown. Her talk can be found on YouTube, "Mattering is Key to Innovation in the University Art Museum." In 2017 she co-authored an NEA Our Town Grant funded at \$200,000 to commission 5 placemaking projects for the city of Youngstown.

She will speak on opportunities for things to happen at the museum that haven't really happened before and will demonstrate how a museum could matter at a university that has established innovation as their mode of operation. There are some exciting changes coming to the Ulrich Museum! Join us as we hear more about her vision for the future and accomplishments in the past year as the new Director.






2019 Reading Rally-LCAM
